The Royal Australian Historical Society invites you to *Collections and Community: Trove and NSW Historical Societies*, presented in partnership with the National Library of Australia (NLA).

This special one-day event explores how community history organisations can use Trove's tools, resources and partnerships to connect collections and strengthen the local history network.

Session A: <i>Connecting Collections: Using Trove to promote local and community history</i>

Overview	Presenters from the NLA will share the latest information on using Trove and explain how historical societies can also become an active contributor. Firstly, Elizabeth Mackenzie will share updated resources, search tips and tools that support researchers to efficiently navigate the vast and ever-growing Trove collections. Fiona Clarke will explain how historical societies and community groups can become Content Contributor partners and share their own collection records with Trove's user community. She will also present on Community Heritage Grants, a long-standing Australian Government grants program that supports community groups care for their nationally significant collections.
